Miss Swanander said that Mrs. Bull claimed to have been visited by the spirits of these persons, and that she had bought gifts for herself at their request.

The Swami Vivekananda, she said, was described as standing under a tree in full bloom, and the child Edwina as appearing in a pink radiance.

Mrs. Edith Swanander, the mother of Miss Swanander, will also give testimony.
